Perry St., and may be viewed from 1 to 8p.m. Friday. Elizabeth "Liz" (Ray) McCathern was born February 3, 1935, in Shelbyville, Tennessee. She was an only child to the late Hattie Mae Stone. Liz departed this life on June 15, 2008, following a lingering illness. As a young adult, she joined New Bethel Baptist Church and was baptized under the Pastorate of Reverend William Bell. She attended Wilson County schools in Tennessee until she moved to Pontiac, Michigan in 1943. In 1953; she married the late Johnnie McCathern. She is survived by 5 children; Rev. Elizabeth loved God, her church and over the years served in numerous auxiliaries such as the seraphic, helped to organize the Sunbeam & Youth Choirs, Sunday school teacher, a Red Circle leader, youth ministry advisor and the young matrons. Her service to the Lord also extended into the ministries of her sons Pastorates and even encouraged her daughter to seek theological training which she currently pursues. Liz's gift of hospitality was a secret to no one. She loved to cook and on any given Sunday many would gather at her table for food, fun and fellowship. She also enjoyed gardening and was recognized and received the "Home Beautification Award" by the City of Pontiac. Liz was passionate about bowling which included her involvement in the Pontiac Teachers League, New Bethel's Church League and National Tournaments.
